Estonia and Latvia are great places for active outdoor recreation, offering a wide range of opportunities to discover something new. Both guests and local residents are often surprised by the untouched landscapes and exciting sparsely-populated areas giving them the chance to get acquainted with traditions and the close relationship between culture, nature and history. Outside cities and towns there are forests, lakes and rivers with countless opportunities to enjoy nature. There are over 1500 islands in Estonia, whereas Latvia is famous for over 500 kilometres of long sandy beaches.

ESTONIA

The southern part of Estonia is famous for its hills, river valleys and lakes. The nature in Southern Estonia interacts with culture in different ways. There are a number of Russian Old Believers communities on the coast of Lake Peipsi, the fifth largest lake in Europe. To this day, the Old Believers maintain age-old traditions and survive on fishing and cultivating vegetables. There is also one of the oldest towns of Estonia - Viljandi where guests can feel the breath of history and get acquainted with Estonia throughout the centuries. Today, it is a modern and tourist-friendly town. There are 35 species of fish in Lake Võrtsjärv, which is also an important place for migrating birds.

Võhandu, the longest Estonian river, marks the historical border of the southern part of Estonia and the territory inhabited by the Setu people where the residents still maintain their ancient traditions.

The western coastline of Estonia invites you to travel through idyllic villages and farmstead landscapes, or to take a sunny trip along the seacoast and enjoy long sunsets. There are over 500 kilometre long roads and trails along the coastline, taking in cultural, historical and nature landscapes. Thanks to the beautiful coastline, Pärnu and Haapsalu are among the popular recreation places in Europe. Kayaking is possible nearly all along the coastline

which is famous for sandy beaches and cliffs and about one and a half thousand islands and islets. The coastline of Estonia is an important stop-over site for migratory waterfowl, and seals can be found near the islands.

Hiiumaa and Saaremaa are the largest islands of Estonia; however, they are small enough to be travelled around in a short period of time. Here you can see the oldest functioning lighthouses in the world, the meteorite crater and traditional Estonian farms, windmills and unspoilt nature. Take the opportunity of getting to know the daily life of residents on the island that still completely differs from life in the city and rural areas of inland Estonia.

LATVIA

Kurzeme is amongst the greenest regions of Latvia, tempting sailors with its ports, both big and small, sun seekers – with its sandy beaches, and nature lovers – with cliffs and protected dunes. Kurzeme's environment is particularly unique due to its ancient fishing villages and towns where guests are able to feel the breath of history and modern urban infrastructure and the rhythm of life. Rivers are the true treasures of Kurzeme – there are about 20 rivers for canoeing, surrounded by forests and meadows in the western part of the region. Most of them flow into the sea, and therefore an opportunity to finish a canoe trip in open water evokes the most exquisite emotions even in true lovers of paddling.

The Riga region is on the outskirts of the capital Riga. Although it is a densely

populated area with an active business environment, it offers a wide range of outdoor recreation opportunities. There are not many cities in Europe where people are able to enjoy an urban environment while at the same time relaxing in the peace and quiet of nature or taking part in forest or water recreation activities in the surrounding area. A beach on the coast of the Gulf of Riga is about a half-hour's drive away from the city. Also, there are a number of recreational places by the river Daugava River and the river Lielupe.

Downtown Riga also offers active leisure facilities like boating along the city canal or the city's lakes. Travelling along the city canal offers a different perspective of the city. There are a lot of lakes near the capital Riga offering a variety of active water sports opportunities. The

calm lower reaches of the river Gauja and the river Daugava are perfect for relaxing stand-up paddling that may be combined with yoga or fitness elements on windless days.

Vidzeme is a region in the central and northern part of Latvia. Here, boatmen have always been attracted by the river Gauja, the most mythical and longest river in Latvia, and the oldest national park, the Gauja National Park. Vidzeme is also blessed with some other beautiful rivers – the picturesque river Salaca, the river Brasla, and the river Amata which is said to be the only mountain river in Latvia. Beautiful nature, traditions and the important cultural and architectural heritage of Vidzeme allows you to feel the breath of history and the natural wealth of the region.



SAAREMAA, HIIUMAA



1 SAAREMAA-VILSANDI

20-30 min. 11

The island of *Vilsandi* is the farthest inhabited western island of Estonia. It is called "the bird paradise" as there are bird migration routes over it.

2 ON THE KUESSAARE BAY

10 km, 4 hours 1

This is a calm kayak route which is extra safe for waves; the bay offers a wonderful view to the bishop's castle and if the weather is good, one can see a nice silhouette of the *Kuessaare* town. There are bird watching towers on your way where you can stop and have a glance at several types of orchids and the oak-grove of *Loode*.

3 KUESSAARE-ABRUKA

2.5 hours 27

The island of *Abruka* offers both unique nature and unusual old mill. The route includes paddling to *Abruka* island (40 min); an hour-long car trip on the island and a return to *Kuessaare*.

4 ON THE VÄINAMERI BAY

1-5 hours

During a kayak trip around the *Saarnaki* and *Hanikatsi* islets visitors can explore the untouched nature of sparsely populated islands and see the old fishermen's houses.

5 KÕRGESSAARE-ROOGRAHU

approximately 40 km, 2 days

A sea-kayak trip around the *Tahkuna* peninsula reveals the beautiful scenery of *Hiiumaa* beaches and the impressive *Tahkuna* lighthouse.

6 AROUND THE HIIUMAA ISLETS

approximately 40 km, 2 days 28

The small islets of *Hiiumaa* give a delightful experience to nature lovers. The islands are the most mysterious part of *Hiiumaa* and paddling is the best way to travel around the archipelago.

WE ALSO RECOMMEND:

Hiiumaa, *Saaremaa* and many other small islands OFFER VARIOUS ACTIVITIES, such as diving and seal-watching tours, surfing, canoe and kayak trips, guided tours to islets and many other possibilities of adventures.

SEASHORE IN THE WEST OF ESTONIA

7 HAAPSALU-VORMSI

12 km, 1.5 hours 14

Simple and enjoyable sailing on a historical vessel near the shore. Departure from the town of *Haapsalu*, destination - *Sviby* port in the island of *Vormsi*. There is an excursion available on the island.

8 HAAPSALU-HOBULAIID-PUSKU VILLAGE

15 km, 5 hours 14

Kayak route from the town of *Haapsalu* along the *Pullapää nina* (*Pullapää* horn) to the *Pusku* village is an ideal option for beginners. The islet of *Hobulaid* is in the middle of the route, inviting kayakers to have a rest.

9 VIRTUSU VANALUUBI-PIVARROOTSI VILLAGE

6 km, 1.5 hours 14

A short kayak tour near the shore. This route is ideal for beginners.

10 KAYAK TOUR AROUND THE MANIJA ISLAND

12 km, 5-6 hours 24

Manija is a small, stony island in the *Pärnu* bay and one of the smallest inhabited islands in Europe. *Manija* with the neighboring *Hanilaid* are both included in the landscape protection area.

11 KAYAK TOUR MUNALAIID-KIHNU

35 km, 2 days 24

Kihnu is the largest island in the Gulf of Riga and the seventh largest island in Estonia. UNESCO has proclaimed *Kihnu's* cultural space and traditions as a Masterpiece of the Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity.

12 KAYAKING ON PÄRNU BAY

10 km, 3-4 hours 24

Pärnu bay is the biggest bay and most important fishing area on the west coast of Estonia. During the kayaking trip you'll see many interesting sights of *Pärnu* town and stop at the watch-tower on *Vana-Pärnu* beach.

WEST-ESTONIA OFFERS, besides sea kayaking, many different and exciting activities, such as surfing, kite surfing, sailing, tours with historical boats and ships, fishing and many other possibilities to enjoy their time.

SOUTHERN ESTONIA



1 PÕLTSAMAA

135 km 115 km, 1–7 days
72 m 1, 2, 16, 18, 32, 45

A unique and historic waterway, discover culture and natural scenery, pass through nature reserves, Põltsamaa town, the Rutikvere and Adavere Manors, Põltsamaa Castle, and Meleski Glass Factory.

2 MUSTJÕGI AND GAUJA

84 km 25 km, 5 hours – 1 day
29.7 m 2, 9, 15, 18, 25, 32

Picturesque scenery, sandstone outcrops, sandy banks and clean water.

3 ÕHNE

94 km 20 km, 2–4 hours
62 m 2, 9, 16

Õhne is narrow, yet fast and exciting river.

4 VÄIKE EMAJÕGI (Little Emajõgi)

84 km 60 km, 2–3 days
81 m 2, 9, 16, 32

The wild character of Väike Emajõgi makes it a very good choice for kayaking.

5 VÕHANDU

162 km 127 km, 1–7 days
102.4 m 2, 9, 15, 18, 25, 32, 37

The longest river in Estonia has a very diverse character and offers both slow canoeing and more extreme kayaking. Explore the sandstone outcrops, the old millponds, dams and enjoy the rapids.

6 SUUR EMAJÕGI (Big Emajõgi)

100 km 100 km, 4–5 days
3.6 m 1, 2, 9, 18, 22, 25, 32, 37, 43, 45

The second longest river in Estonia is suitable for paddling throughout its length. It flows through the Alam-Pedja Nature Reserve, Tartu and again through swampy lowland of Emajõe-Suursoo.

7 AMME

59 km 59 km, 1–2 days
51.6 m 2, 9

Amme is a tributary of Emajõgi River. It begins at Lake Kuremaa near Palamuse, and then flows through Lake Kaiavere and Lake Elistvere until it reaches Emajõgi.

8 AHJA

102.2 km 17 km, 3 hours
87.6 m 2, 9, 15, 16, 18, 25, 32

Ahja River is suitable for both the beginners and experienced canoeists. The river is surrounded by sandstone outcrops and the area of Taevaskoja is one of the most beautiful places of Estonian nature.

9 HALLISTE

99.8 km 70 km, 2 days
87.6 m 2, 5, 13, 32, 35, 36, 43

Wild nature where you will meet no people, see neither villages nor any other human activity.



WE ALSO RECOMMEND:

DOWN THE EMAJÕGI RIVER ON A TRADITIONAL BARGE

A boat ride on the traditional barge *Jõmmu* is a unique opportunity to see places which are unreachable from land, such as river banks and lake shores, swamps and flood-lands.

RIDE IN A TRADITIONAL SAILING YACHT ON THE VÕRTSJÄRV LAKE

Sailing yacht and its crew invite groups of up to 12 people and offer both recreation and introduction to sailing. It is possible to agree on duration and program of the trip.

THE FIFTH SEASON IN THE SOOMAA NATIONAL PARK

13, 35, 36, 43
The period of spring floods in Soomaa National Park is called "the fifth season". The water level in rivers and lakes can rise by up to five meters. Paddle on rivers

16 ELVA

85.3 km 60 km, 2–3 days
144 m 2, 16, 25, 32

Small sandstone outcrops, well-developed infrastructure of water tourism with plenty of recreational places, dams and watermills.

17 PÄRNU

144 km 144 km, 7–8 days
76.2 m 5, 8, 15, 23, 24, 35

One of the largest rivers in Estonia, people call it "the Estonian Mississippi" as it has large floods. The river banks hold the oldest human settlement in Estonia.

18 AUDRU

30.3 km 30 km, 1 day
16.4 m 5

The river flows through the Audru Manor complex, meandering under four bridges.

19 REIU

73 km 73 km, 2 days
50 m 5

This river hosts plenty of fish – one can find 22 different species there.

12 NAVESTI

106.1 km 50 km, 1–2 days
60.2 m 2, 5, 32, 35, 36, 41

The river flows near the road and is easily accessible in many places. Get out of your canoe and take a walk down the trails of Soomaa National Park's wilderness.

15 TÄNASSILMA

36.3 km 10 km, 2–3 hours
8.3 m 2, 22, 35, 36

This is a calm and curved Hanseatic waterway.

20 KOORASTE JÄRVESTIK (Kooraste lakes)

14 km 14 km, 5 hours – 1 day
2, 25, 32

Up to 11 connected lakes offer a wild expedition on the river, sometimes you might need to take the canoe out of the river to pass dams made by beavers or wade in the stream and pull the boat.



21 KASARI

127 km 25 km, 1 day 7
Kasari is a calm river that will guide you through the Matsalu National Park which hosts 282 bird, 49 fish and 47 mammal breeds.

22 SAUGA

77 km, 2 days 5
Calm and narrow river that flows under several bridges and past many fishermen's piers and swimming areas.



VIDZEME AND RIGA REGION

1 GAUJA

452 km 425 km, ~ 10 days
195 m 50-56, 59-61, 63, 64, 68-70, 72, 74, 75, 77, 82, 91, 93

The Gauja River is the longest river in Latvia with spectacular banks. It is famous for its diversity – meanders, russet sandstone rocks, cliffs, ancient valleys and ravines.

2 AMATA

75 km 56 km, 2 days;
20 km, 1 day 193 m 50, 55, 59, 60, 72, 74, 75, 77, 93

Amata is said to be the only mountain river in Latvia. In spring it is the best place to be if you are looking for an adrenaline-pumping adventure. The river flows through the Gauja National Park, there are flat meadows and steep rocks on the banks of the river.

3 BRASLA

70 km 45 km, 2 days;
28 km, 1 day 68 m 50, 54, 55, 59, 64, 68, 70, 74, 75, 84, 93

Enjoy a picturesque trip across the meandering river Brasla which is full of rapids flowing along the rocky banks of the Gauja National Park. You should definitely see “Vējiņi” which has underground lakes and caves.

4 ABULS

52 km 20 km, 1 day
129 m 52, 59

Abuls River is perfect for a recreational trip as there are the historical sights of Trikāta and a pleasant recreational area at the “Brenguļi” brewery on the banks of the river.

5 SALACA

95 km 95 km, 4 days 42 m
50, 52, 54, 55, 59-61, 63, 64, 67, 68, 70, 74, 75, 84, 88, 93

The pearl of the Northern Vidzeme – Salaca is a quiet and calm river with swirling rapids in some places, moving from the shadows of sandstone rocks to sunny sandbanks and coloured rock piles.

6 AIVIEKSTE

114 km 114 km, 4 days
29 m 48, 49, 55, 60, 63, 64, 69, 74, 75

Combine a canoe trip across the calm Aiviekste River with bird-watching and fishing.

7 PEDEDZE

159 km 81 km, 4-5 days
108 m 48, 49, 55, 59, 63, 64, 69, 74, 75, 79

Pededze River is famous for untouched nature, clear water, sandy beaches and oak trees on its banks.

8 OGRE

188 km 130 km, 5 days
222 m 54, 55, 59, 63, 64, 68, 70, 74, 75

Ogre River tempts with 10 km long overfalls and the Brāžu rapids in the Ērgļi area. It is a fast flowing and meandering river with dolomite outcrops and a few sandstone rocks on its banks, running through sparsely populated areas.



9 LIELĀ JUGLA

63 km 27 km, 6 hours
70.6 m 55, 59, 63, 64, 68, 74, 75

In periods of high-water, the river has many rapids that form large waves between Bajāri and Zaķumuiža. The banks of the river are mostly overgrown with bushes, so make sure you choose the best time for a landing place.

10 MAZĀ JUGLA

119 km 48.5 km, 1.5 days
112 m 55, 59, 63, 64, 68, 74, 75

The route begins with a canoe trip along two small, picturesque dolomite outcrops on the right bank of the river. In high-water periods, the river has many small rapids and there are a number of barriers to make the paddling more interesting.

11 SVĒTUPE / JAUNUPE

58 km 29 km, 1-2 days
49 m 55, 59, 67

The character of this river changes depending on the season. The river flows faster in high-water periods, offering a fast ride, while in summer it challenges you with fallen trees and shallow rapids. To enjoy the rocky cliffs and the challenging river bed, choose proper equipment.

12 MISA

108 km 20 km, 1-2 days
42 m 63, 68

Misa River is easily to canoe; wild banks alternate with garden areas. In the high-water season you can navigate the canoe across overflow meadows.

13 DAUGAVA (over Rigas Hydroelectric power station)

352 km (L territory of Latvia)
11 km, 3 hours 99 m
63, 68

It is the perfect route for beginners and paddlers interested in history-related objects – World War I Memorial on the Island of Death (Nāves sala), a number of castle mounds, etc.

WE ALSO RECOMMEND:

14 SEDA, 15 RŪJA,

16 BRIEDE – quiet, calm rivers flowing into the mythical lake Burtnieks.

17 VAIDAVA – fast flowing, meandering river near the picturesque Raganu cliffs (Witches' Cliffs) in Ape. Enjoy the sandstone and dolomite outcrop from a boat or take a walk along the cliffs in summer when the river is shallow enough to walk across it.

18 VITRUPE – is a several kilometre long and fast flowing discovery in periods of high-water for those who are no longer surprised by Amata – a picturesque ancient valley, deep with steep sandstone outcrops, a diversity of forest landscapes, and with obstacles for experienced boatmen.





THE COASTLINE OF LATVIA

1 AROUND THE KOLKAS-RAGS TO THE KOLKAS-RAGS LIGHTHOUSE

10-14 km, 1 day 64

Kolkasrags is a well-shaped cape on the coasts of Latvia which is the meeting point of 2 seas. The place is famous for unusual weather and strange waves. We recommend extreme adventure lovers to take a kayak trip to the Kolka lighthouse located on an island 6 km off the coast.

2 ZIEMUPE-PĀVILOSTA-JŪRKALNE

up to 40 km, 1-3 days 54, 58, 64, 65

Untouched nature, white and quiet beaches, pine forests and cliffs makes the Baltic Sea coast a unique destination. Travel the route by sea kayaks or SUP boards that are suitable for wave surfing in the sea or floating down calm waters to enjoy the picturesque scenery and sunsets on the water.

3 VIDZEME ROCKY SEASIDE: TŪJA-VITRUPE

18 km, 1 day 64, 68

One of the most spectacular parts of the Baltic Sea coast. It is famous for untouched rocky capes, picturesque sandstone outcrops which are unique in the Baltic States. The route also includes also Ķurmragi lighthouse, the Tūja pier and the Vitrupe ravine.



4 RANDU MEADOWS, SALACGRĪVA-AINAŽI

12 km, 4 hours 64, 68

The banks are famous for a special ecosystem – coastal meadows with unique biotopes of Europe. The finish at the border of Latvia and Estonia is marked with one of the most interesting rock piers in Latvia. The rock pier serves as a symbolic borderline.



5 WINDSURFING, KITE BOARDING AND LONGE CÔTE

65, 68, 83, 85, 89, 90

The Baltic Sea coast and the coast of the Gulf of Riga is the perfect place for wind sports. Longe côte ("Along-the-coast") is an exciting walk that you can take in almost any season. It is healthy and delivers the same results you would expect from fitness.



RIGA AND RIGA REGION



6 LIELUPE

119 km, 4 km, 3 hours 44, 51, 52, 54, 58, 64, 65, 66, 69

A different view of the famous resort in the Baltic States – Jūrmala. The Lielupe River is a great route for beginners looking for a calm trip through the town and untouched coastal nature. The Lielupe River is popular among fishermen, and is often chosen for yacht trips and sports activities.

7 DAUGAVA, RIGA CITY CANAL

up to 15 km, up to 6 hours 44, 51, 52, 54, 58, 65, 66, 69

City sightseeing and boating in the very heart of the capital! It is an opportunity to see Riga from a completely different, unconventional perspective.

RIGA CIRCLE – a trip by a kayak or a SUP through the historic City Canal, through 16 bridges, a number of parks, along the Old Town (Vecrīga) and the Castle of Light – the National Library of Latvia. Feast your eyes on the historic and modern architecture, and enjoy the tranquillity of the parks.

NIGHT IN RIGA – take a trip to Riga city centre which looks like a spectacular stage. The trip starts in the evening with a view of the sunset over the river Daugava, followed by a performance of the city lights and lanterns and illuminated bridges of the City Canal. What a wonderful night in Riga!

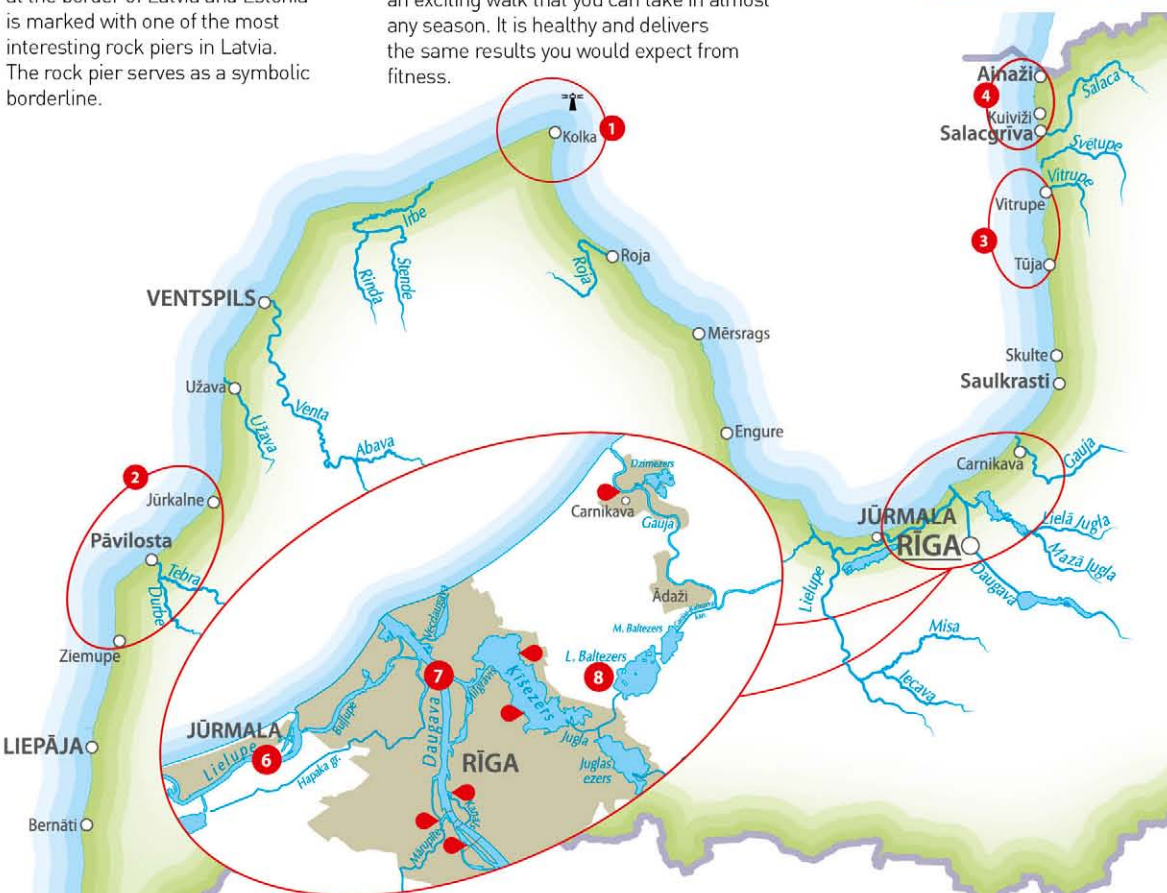
AROUND THE ISLANDS – a great opportunity to not only view the beautiful parks of Riga and the Castle of Light but also the silhouettes of the Old Town (Vecrīga) and the green islands of the river Daugava – Zaķusala, Lucavsala and Ķīpsala.

RIGA SHIPYARD – the old shipyard can only be viewed from the water. The docks are full of smaller and larger ships waiting for the day to arrive when they are restored and ready to set sail again.

8 RIGA LAKES, THE MOUTH OF THE GAUJA RIVER

40 km, 1 day 44, 54, 64, 66, 69

If you would like to discover and see the natural diversity near Riga, a day in a boat or on a SUP is an excellent choice. Lake Ķīšezers offers a wide choice of activities for people looking for active recreation and adventures to challenge their abilities and endurance.



KURZEME AND RIGA REGION



1 IRBE

32 km 32 km, 1–2 days
8 m 46, 55, 57, 64–66, 71, 75, 76, 81, 86, 89

One of the most beautiful rivers in Kurzeme. There are sand dunes along the banks of the river and the river flows through sparsely populated areas of pine tree that was once a restricted area during the period of the Soviet Union. To extend the length of the route, you can set off from either of the two tributaries of the river Irbe River – the Rinda or the Stende.

2 ROJA

78 km 20 km, 1 day 52 m
55, 64–66, 73, 75, 76, 81, 87, 89

The Roja River is one of the wildest rivers in Kurzeme – rocky, and with steep banks which have large tree roots. You may encounter some obstacles in the river; however it maintains a steady flow.

3 RĪVA

53 km 18 km, 1 day 66 m
55, 64–66, 71, 75, 76, 80, 81, 89

It is a small, narrow, meandering river with steep and scenic banks overgrown with pine trees and fir-trees. It flows into the sea through a canyon-shaped ravine at the Labrags cliff.

4 DURBE

48 km 35 km, 1–2 days
20 m 55, 64–66, 71, 75, 76, 78, 80, 81, 89

Enjoy the picturesque scenery of Durbe ancient valley with cliffs, which are several metres in height in some parts. The banks of the river are mostly flat and the river flows slowly. The confluence of the River Durbe and the Tebra River creates the Saka River which flows into the sea. The route may be ended in Pāvilosta, which is one of the most charming towns on the Kurzeme coast.

5 TEBRA

69 km 32 km, 1–2 days 93 m
55, 64–66, 71, 75, 76, 80, 81, 89

The upper reaches of the Tebra River are fast flowing, particularly when boating after a long period of rain, while the lower reaches of the river becomes wider and calmer as it approaches the sea.

6 ABAVA

129 km 60 km, 1–4 days 51 m
46, 47, 55, 62–66, 68, 71, 75, 76, 78, 80, 81, 84, 89

With its picturesque banks and scenic ancient valley the River Abava is one of the favourite rivers amongst water tourists in Kurzeme. There are a wide range of tourism activities on the banks of the river – local wine tasting, a treetop cable ride over the river, nature trails, summer toboggan track, and many more.

7 VENTA

346 km (LV 173 km) 76 km, 1–4 days 166 m (LV 40 m)
46, 47, 55, 62, 64–66, 71, 75, 76, 80, 81, 89, 92

The Venta is a large and fairly slow river. The most popular boat route starts from the Lithuanian border to Skrunda – there are dolomite outcrops and rocks on the banks of the river as well as rapids and fords in some parts.



8 BĀRTA

98 km (LV 44 km) 156 m (LV 10 m)
55, 62, 64–66, 71, 75, 76, 80, 81, 89

The River Bārta looks deceptively small on the map. Actually, it is rather large and calm, surrounded by forests. The river is perfect for families with children.



9 VECSLOCENE

A route is rich in contrasts, surprisingly close to Riga. The river is the best choice for people who love nature but are too busy to take longer trips outside the city. Paddling down the Vecslocene River offers also an opportunity to watch the diversity of birds and plants in the Ķemeri National Park. The river is surrounded by reed banks, creating labyrinths and making you feel like being in an exotic place.

WE ALSO RECOMMEND:

If you prefer a trip through particularly quiet and untouched nature where you can see animals and watch different species of birds, as well as doing some fishing, take a trip across the

21 UŽAVA, **22 VĀRTĀJA** or **23 ENGURE**.

We recommend paddling across the

24 FORTRESS CHANNEL

in **LIEPĀJA**. The channel is a part of a military camp in the north of Liepāja which was built in the late 19th century by the order of the Russian Tsar Alexander III.

In the spring or the autumn rainy season, enjoy the extreme excitement of paddling in the small streams and rapids of the rivers in Kurzeme and Riga region where the water level is usually too low. Among these rivers are:
