Program entrance conditions

Further education program - 460 hours

Entrance conditions:

 diploma in the building sector + 2 years of professional experience in wood construction

or

 5 years of professional experience in wood construction sector



Legislation and Regulation

Existing European laws and regulations in wooden building construction

Wood Construction techniques

Wood in energy-efficient building and renovation, wood-framed building, insulation, ventilation, air tightness, ecological materials

Project Management

Start and preparation of the construction project, interaction with clients and suppliers, documentation, project technical and financial supervision

Marketing for Wood Construction sector

Marketing strategies for wood construction companies

Quality

Wood treatment and maintenance requirements, financial and technical analysis of the project

Human Resources Management

Conflict management, health and safety

How to decide about level of the qualification?

- To study and use the existing EQF as a reference tool for developed programme
- To fix the content level in national qualification system
- Relation of national qualifications systems to the European Qualifications Framework by 2010
- Proposal about the training program level in EQF - LEVEL 5 or 6 (until now)

Certification proceedings

- Structure of exam:
- 1) The knowledge test multiple choice questionnaire
- 2)The test based on analysis of technical project written and oral test
- Consequence
- State recognized qualification (not yet by EQF in LV) and
- 2) European certificate with EQF refluxed level
